

ESSER III Assurance Statement  
Dec. 2021

In the summer of 2020 the “What If” committee was formed to help make decisions based on the pandemic. The “What If” committee is made up of Board Members, Staff, Special Education, Community Members, and the administration of Loomis Public School. As money was doled out for CARES, ESSER II and ESSER III all members of the What If committee were consulted in regards to needs pertaining to student success at Loomis Public School. Administration has participated in ZOOM conferences with NDE Commissioner, and our local Department of Health and Human Services, Two Rivers Region. The administration and board of education has considered recommendations from Two Rivers and the What If committee in regards to a Plan for Safe Return to School. The plan has been posted on our website and social media soliciting community input.

Loomis Public has addressed learning loss among students, including low income, children with disabilities, English learners, racial and ethnic minorities, students experiencing homelessness, and children and youth in foster care, of the local education agency by

- 1) Administering High Quality Assessments that are valid and reliable to accurately identify progress of our students
- 2) Implement evidence based activities to meet comprehensive needs of students
- 3) Provide information and assistance to parents and families on how to support student progress
- 4) Ability to track student attendance and improve engagement.

Loomis Public School purchased NDE recommended K-8 Science Curriculum, 7-12 ELA Curriculum, NDE recommended as well as In-Service for Wonders- Reading Program.

In addition, LPS invested inspection, testing, maintenance, repair, replacement, and upgrade projects to improve the indoor air quality in school facilities, including mechanical and non mechanical heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, filtering and other air cleaning, fans control systems and window and door repair and replacement. Loomis Public School has committed to completing the HVAC project started in ESSER II.
