

# **Winter Sports**

Basketball and Wrestling are underway. That means home games and expectations! Please keep your students in the bleachers until there are breaks in the game such as time outs and quarter breaks. Students may be in the concession stand/cafeteria area and the gym. If there is a game being played in the old gym they can be in there. If there is not a game they cannot be in there.

### Attendance

With winter comes cold and flu season. It is important for students to be in school, however, if your child is sick (throwing up, Strep Throat; etc.), keep them home. If they are sent home from school they will need to be 24 hour fever free or have a doctor's note to return. If they are gone and there is an activity the next day, they do need a doctor's note to be cleared to participate in the activity. Kids don't like to miss practice or games, however, if there is a chance of them being contagious it could affect their entire team.

Attendance is mandatory and we have to keep records on EVERY absence. We send out reminders at 5 days, 10 days, 15 days, and 20 days. We also have regular contact with the county attorney's office about absences. It is a state statute that students who have accumulated 20 absences are automatically reviewed by the County Attorney. Any time you acquire a doctor's note for an absence, that absence will not count against you. For example: if I have 22 absences and have 15 doctor's notes (medical, dentist, eye, counselor, PT, etc.) those 15 absences will not count. Partial day absences will add up, though. We look at 20 total days and above. Get doctor's notes whenever possible.

# It all began with the letter J.

In preschool, we learn by doing. Each week a new letter is introduced to the class to explore and experience. We trace it. We write it. We paint it. We build it. And sometimes, we even taste it.

We did all of the typical activities that 'J week' brings. We colored jaguars, we swam like jellyfish, we jumped, we told jokes, we even made our own peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. But we needed something more: joy.

The concept of joy can be tricky to teach. We often think of happiness and what brings us happiness. And if you ask three, four and five year olds, they'll tell you Joy is a girl with blue hair in the movie Inside Out. But joy is much more than that. Joy is the kind of happiness that doesn't depend on what happens. Try teaching that to preschoolers!

The hardest part was explaining how to have joy even when things don't go our way. We focused on the importance of joy and sharing joy with others. This was a fun, energetic way to experience joy by using "happy spots" the preschoolers dispersed among their peers as fast as possible. We looked like jaguars, contagious with joy.

We explored many ways to find, share and have joy. Preschool realized that it was the simplest of acts of joy that made the biggest impact. Each preschooler chose one person in school to receive a yellow balloon. The smiles were instant. Hugs were shared and hearts were touched. Each recipient could choose to keep their joy, or to pass it along. Before they would share, they must sign the card that accompanied the balloon. We hoped others would follow suit and were delighted each time we caught a glimpse of a yellow balloon being delivered. Some even found their way back to our class before they went again to bring joy to someone else.

445 people found joy today because of these yellow balloons, and it all began with the letter 'J'.
